## About the CIVITAS Forum Conference

The **CIVITAS Forum** makes its return with a dynamic three-day conference, serving as the flagship event of the **CIVITAS Initiative**. Since its creation in 2003, the CIVITAS Forum has become an essential platform for participants to learn from leaders and experts of sustainable and smart mobility. It also promotes the sharing of ideas and helps build relationships among important players involved in transforming urban mobility across Europe.

The **CIVITAS Forum 2024** will take place in the picturesque **city of Parma**, Italy, from **1-3 October 2024**. It will focus on how the CIVITAS community is shaping the future of urban mobility and contributing to the *mobility renaissance*! Typically attracting around 600 attendees, the conference will see participation from a diverse group of stakeholders including city representatives, policymakers, practitioners, planners, academics, and mobility enthusiasts.

## Conference theme and streams

The topics guiding the CIVITAS Forum 2024 are in line with the main theme of the event ***“Mobility Renaissance: a holistic approach to urban transformation”***.

Just as the Renaissance redefined cultural and societal norms, today’s urban environments need a similarly innovative approach to mobility. This involves moving beyond traditional transportation models to embrace a holistic perspective on urban development. It is about integrating sustainability, inclusivity, technology, and community engagement to build a transportation system that is not just for travel, but also supports a thriving future.

This comprehensive approach to mobility underpins the conference, which is organized into **three vertical streams**, each delving into different aspects of this complex landscape

### **Stream 1: Climate-neutral and resilient mobility**

In this stream, innovative strategies and technologies aimed at achieving climate-neutral mobility in urban environments, including initiatives undertaken by the 100 Climate-Neutral and Smart Cities, will be explored. Examples of topics in this stream include: the promotion of active transportation modes, the adoption of clean energy vehicles, and the implementation of sustainable infrastructure.

### **Stream 2: Smart, connected and efficient mobility**

This stream will delve into the transformative potential of smart, connected and efficient mobility solutions in shaping the future of urban transportation. Examples of topics in this stream include: the integration of advanced technologies, like artificial intelligence and digital twins, optimization of traffic management systems, and enhancement of urban connectivity.

### **Stream 3: Inclusive and safe mobility for all**

Within this stream, an emphasis will be placed on participatory and inclusive methodologies in urban mobility planning and design. Examples of topics in this stream include, urban space design, enhancing public involvement in decision-making processes, and tackling equity concerns in transportation access.

If you're interested in presenting at the CIVITAS Forum 2024, please ensure your proposal fits into one of the above outlined streams, as well as aligns with one of the below mentioned sessions. Your presentation should reflect the Forum's main themes and provide new ideas and solutions to urban mobility challenges. A broad approach is suggested. Please note, it is necessary to be present in Parma, should you wish to be a speaker.

## Types of Sessions

Applicants can propose one of two main types of sessions:

- **Panel Session:** This is a structured discussion moderated and featuring multiple speakers. Each speaker should share unique insights and perspectives on the specified topic. Short presentations accompanied by effective visuals are recommended to enhance the discussion. Please ensure visuals are clear, professional, and support the conveyed messages.
- **Interactive Session:** These sessions are designed to engage the audience, and is suitable for workshops, roundtable discussions, or interactive presentations. Applicants are encouraged to propose innovative formats that facilitate participant interaction and engagement. The final format for these sessions will be confirmed by the organizing committee based on feasibility and conference goals.

Please note, support for session design and technical needs will be provided by the conference organizers. Further details on the implementation of interactive sessions and any necessary adjustments will be communicated to the speakers ahead of the event.

## Submission Guidelines and Process

Please review the following guidelines carefully to ensure your proposal aligns with the expectations and standards of the CIVITAS Forum 2024

- **Joint submissions:** If you choose to collaborate with others for a joint presentation, please coordinate with your fellow contributors to submit a single, cohesive proposal. Ensure that the roles and contributions of each participant are clearly defined.
- **Avoid repeating speakers:** To bring fresh perspectives to the Forum, we encourage avoiding repeat appearances by the same speakers across different sessions. This helps maintain a diverse and engaging program.
- **Highlight diverse contributors:** We strongly encourage presentations from cities and technology providers involved in your projects, rather than project coordinators. This approach showcases the practical applications and innovations directly from those who implement and benefit from them.

**Disclaimer:** It's important to note that the organizing committee reserves the right to request adjustments to proposed session types and content. This may include suggestions to modify the session format or merge its content with another proposal for better coherence or coverage of thematic areas.

**Tip!:** Keep your proposal clear and focused.

## Criteria

In terms of **criteria**, the following aspects will be considered:

- Alignment between the session description and your proposed contribution.
- Innovation embedded in the abstract presented, including solutions, methodologies, and strategies being presented.
- Relevance to the goals and endeavours of the CIVITAS Initiative and the CIVITAS Community, as a whole.
- Proficiency in communication and/or demonstrated speaking skills and experience.
- While participation from individuals involved in sustainable urban mobility initiatives beyond the CIVITAS network is encouraged, priority will be given to stakeholders associated with the CIVITAS Community (CIVITAS projects, CIVINETs, members of the CIVITAS Network of cities, etc.).

## Evaluators

All submitted applications will be evaluated by the CIVITAS Programme Committee (formed by the main organisers, in cooperation with the European Commission).

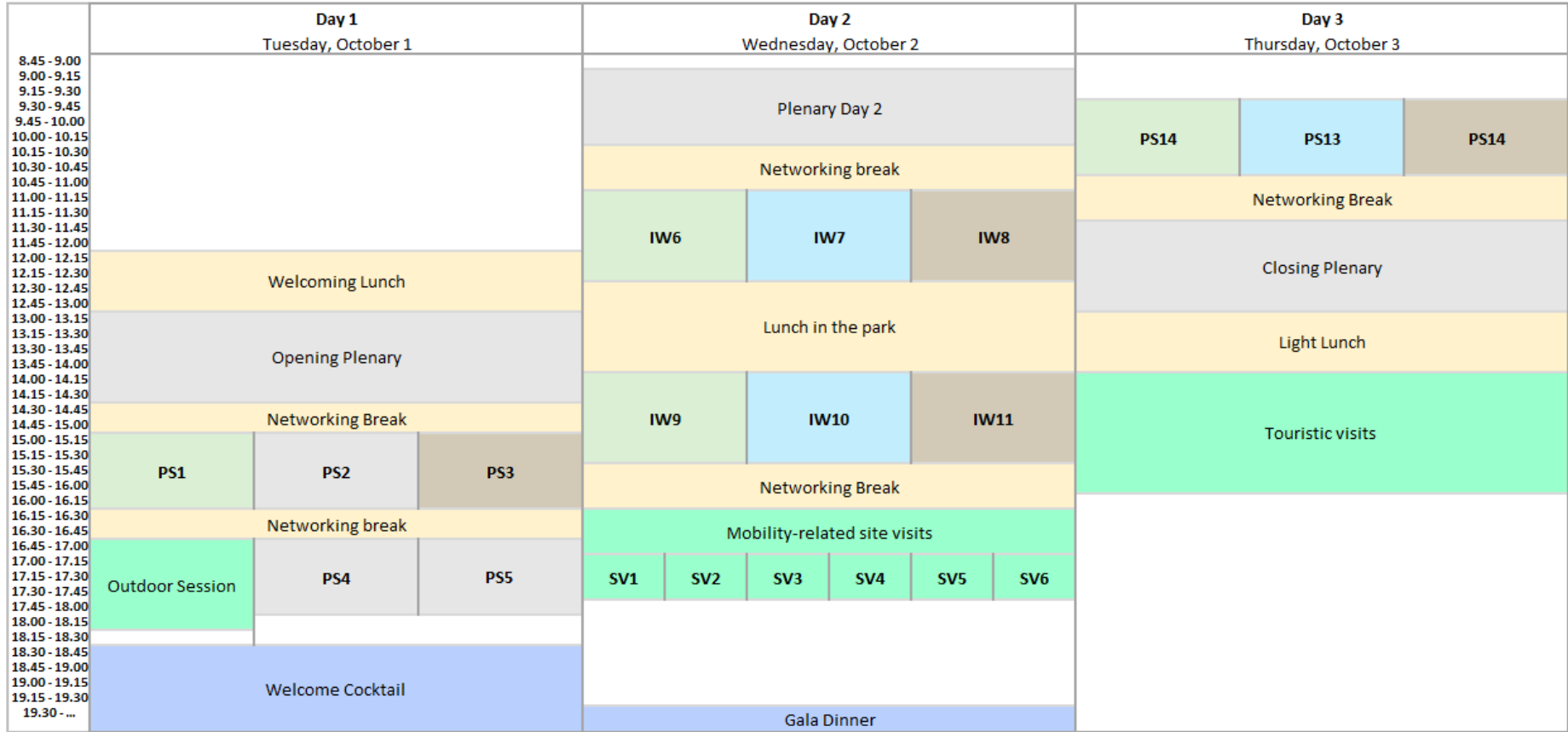
