



EN-UAC Calls Under Preparation

- Joint Sino-European call (launch end of 2021-beginning of 2022)
 - Funding from several European countries and China for Sino-European consortia
 - Topics:
 - Sustainable individual mobility
 - Sustainable urban logistics
 - Multimodalities in transport system
- Pilot Knowledge Hub in the field of urban accessibility and connectivity (launch end of 2021 – beginning of 2022)
 - Individual experts targeted for the constitution of a knowledge hub
 - Mapping of regional, national, European and international key projects addressing UAC (availability, transparency and accessibility of research results)
 - Creation of learning formats that fit the various stakeholder needs
