Transportation in the city

- **By foot:** Walking is a fast and healthy way of getting around in the city center, and you can do some sightseeing on the way.
- **Bike:** Antwerp is a true biking city. The [Velo city bikes](#) have become a familiar sight around the city. There is always one nearby. Find a Velo at one of the Velo stations, cycle to your destination (max. 30 min) and park your city bike at another station. Easy and fast! We can provide day passes if you are interested
