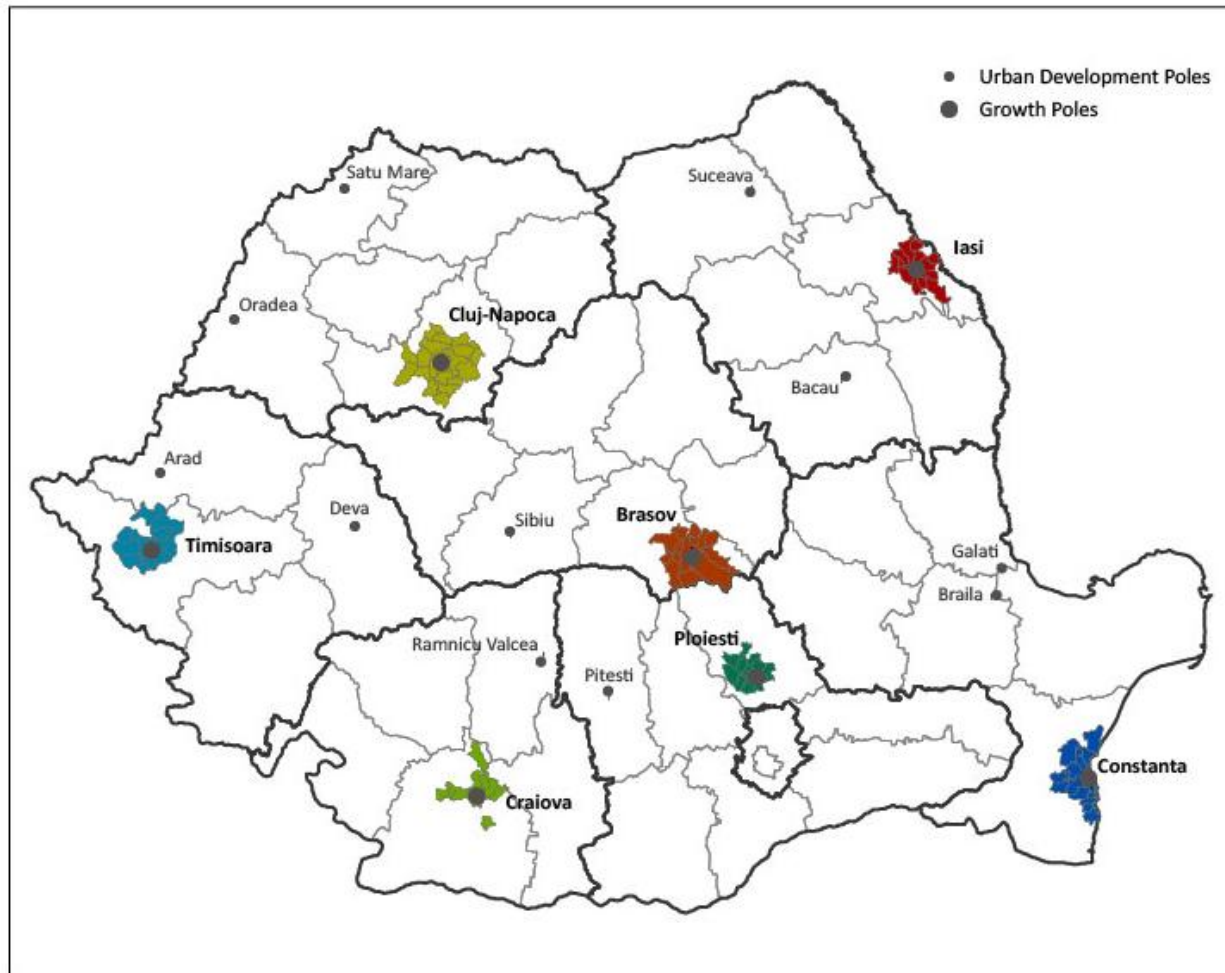


Background and objectives

The development of Sustainable Urban Mobility Plans for the growth poles was agreed, as a priority by the Ministry of Regional Development and Public Administration and the European Commission, to become the frame of urban transport projects to be financed under the Operational Programme Regional Development for the 2014-2020 period with European Regional Development Fund.

The desired Sustainable Urban Mobility Plan for the seven growth poles (Brasov, Cluj-Napoca, Constanta, Craiova, Iasi, Ploiesti and Timisoara) and Bucharest-Ilfov agglomeration is a strategic plan designed to satisfy the mobility needs of people and businesses in the cities and their surroundings for a better quality of life at present and in the future.

Map of growth poles and Bucharest-Ilfov agglomeration

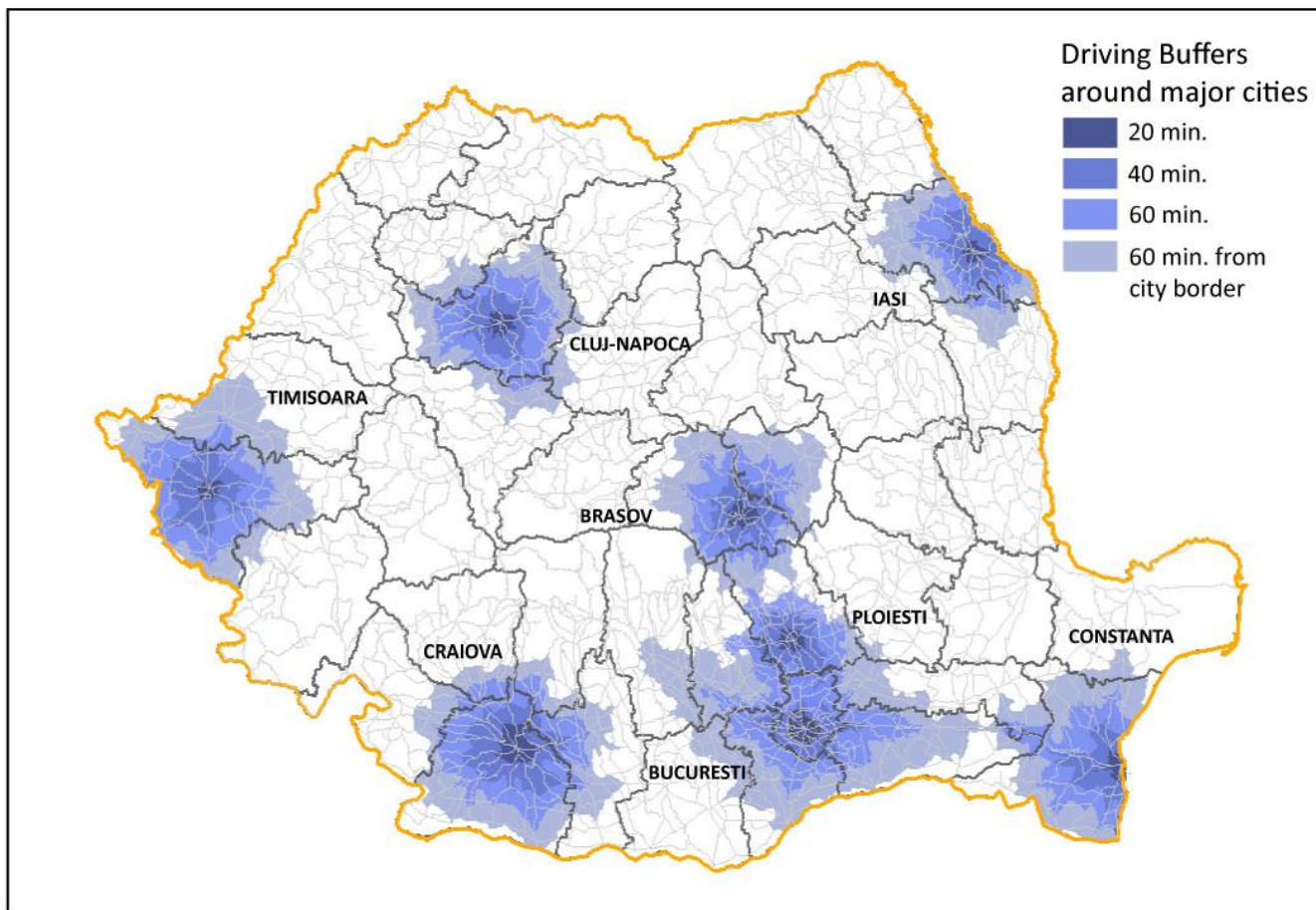

Challenges :

- To harmonize urban and territorial development with road, rail, shipping, air and public transport according to the mobility needs of persons and goods;
- To suggest an institutional and legal framework for efficiently managing the transport system at the growth pole level;
- To combine existing and planned investments which have been assessed primarily at the city level into a system of infrastructure;
- To develop scenario options and identify the most appropriate and sustainable solutions for an integrated mobility;
- To elaborate an agreed action plan in order to have a correlated implementation of the efficient measures on short term (until 2015), as well as medium term (until 2020);
- To elaborate a general and specific set of indicators, regarding the mobility, socio-economic and urban development of the territory.

Potential functional areas are larger than the currently defined metropolitan areas
